You are receiving a copy of this letter because your residence is located within or near a designated High Fire Hazard Severity Zone. This means that from May to early November, your property is prone to the hazards associated with wildfire.

Please don't hesitate taking the necessary steps needed to better safeguard your home, property and family against wildfire. Here are some important suggestions to help you prepare for the numerous types of emergencies that could negatively impact our area:

1. Take a Get Ready Marin disaster preparedness course. This two-hour seminar can give you critical information needed to prepare for the types of major emergencies that could strike Marin County. Refer to <http://getreadymarin.org/> for more information.

During the fire season, please be particularly vigilant on hot, dry and windy days. Serious wildfires tend to be weather driven events. Thus, there is a greater potential for a major wildfire when the weather is extreme.
